We currently partner with several organizations that provide invaluable experiences for our participants:

Auer Farm, Bloomfield, CT: Here, our individuals take part in essential farm maintenance tasks such as cleaning animal cages, feeding the animals, and tidying common areas for visitors. This hands-on work not only enhances their responsibility but also connects them with nature and the community.

Horace Bushnell Children's Food Pantry, Hartford, CT: Volunteers prepare groceries, organize food and clothing items, stock shelves, and manage inventory. Additionally, participants engage in recycling efforts by separating cans and plastics, gaining insight into sustainability practices while serving those in need.

Westmoor Farms, West Hartford, CT: At this site, individuals learn the art of horticulture, from planting seeds to harvesting crops. This experience not only cultivates agricultural skills but also deepens their understanding of the food cycle and the importance of local farming.

Camp Courant, Farmington, CT: Participants engage in a variety of activities that promote teamwork and community spirit, making memories that last a lifetime.

Hands on Hartford, Hartford, CT: This organization offers opportunities to assist with various community programs, further broadening the scope of skills and experiences available to our individuals.



# Bloom Where Planted: Nurturing Growth Through Nature



At Harc, we are thrilled to partner with Bloom Where Planted, a therapeutic plant and nature program that enriches our community with engaging, hands-on activities a few days each month. Led by the passionate Amy Lopez, this program offers participants a unique opportunity to explore the world of plants while fostering sensory, educational, and motor skills development.

Amy, who holds specialized training in Therapeutic Horticulture, combines her knowledge of disabilities and mental health to create a supportive environment for our individuals. Her Visiting Group Program, conveniently located within an hour's drive from Burlington, Connecticut, brings all necessary materials, ensuring that each session is well-prepared and impactful.

Every visit with Bloom Where Planted is a new adventure. Participants from our Life Enrichment Program, Bulova Center, and Explorative Day program learn to identify and care for various plants, engage in potting and planting seeds, and practice essential coordination and motor skills. Each session is thoughtfully designed to be both fun and beneficial, with individuals leaving with a tangible reminder of their experience—a plant or seedling to nurture at home.

Amy's exceptional ability to connect with our Harc individuals stands out. She not only facilitates enjoyable activities but also prioritizes their overall wellness, helping to enhance their physical and emotional health through the therapeutic benefits of nature.

Through Bloom Where Planted, our Harc individuals are not just growing plants—they are blossoming in their personal development. We are grateful for Amy's dedication and the positive impact her program has on our participants' lives.

### Kadeisha's New Job Opportunity



Kadeisha Cunningham recently underwent training and has started her new role as a camp counselor at Harc's Capable Kids summer camp. She says she loves working at the camp and feels great about enjoying her work. "I have a lot of fun with the kids," Kadeisha shared.

Kadeisha also reflected on her new job compared to her previous roles at SockStarz and Harc's business office. "This job is different because I am outdoors. I get to see new faces. All of my jobs have been easy because I get along with people well and enjoy being around them," she explained.

Her favorite thing about camp? "All of it. I love to see the kids happy, and if they are upset, I can talk to them and say, 'Don't be shy. It's okay... I am here to help."

Kadeisha will be working at the camp until it ends on August 2nd. Afterward, she will return to her other job at a school, where she works in the cafeteria assisting the chef with preparing food for the children. Occasionally, she also works at the register or serves food. "Little kids would give me a hug and say, 'welcome to my school", Kadeisha mentioned fondly.






### **Financials**

### **Financial Summary**

Harc is dedicated to long-term viability through diverse revenue streams. Our current financial support includes a mix of contracts with state agencies, service fees from Medicaid and private insurance companies, supported employment contracts with local companies, grants, and individual donations. In Fiscal Year 2024, we proudly acheived a twelve percent increase in revenue. We prioritize optimizing resources and minimizing administrative expenses. Strong partnerships with vendors help mitigate costs, even amid high inflation. As a result, our total expenses rose by only one percent this fiscal year. Our commitment to fiscal accountability ensures that we can continue to provide services for the lifetime of not only the current individuals we serve but all those that we will serve in the future.




### **Revenue by Function**

- 1% Investments and Other Sources




### **Expenses by Function**
