Nonprofit Alliance Day at the Capitol 2023



Harc was selected amongst 47 other organizations to participate in Nonprofit Alliance Day at the Capitol on May 16, 2023. This flagship event of The Alliance provided the opportunity for Connecticut nonprofits to set up a booth on the first floor of the State Capitol in Hartford, to educate policymakers and the public about the exceptional work Harc does for the community.

This event highlighted the diversity and impact of work that community nonprofits do to enhance the quality of life for all residents and families of Connecticut. We were also able to meet and educate individuals from different nonprofits, including some of our legislature that was at the LOB. We filled out "leave-behind-forms" to tell leadership and the Governor to support increasing funding for nonprofits by 9% in $FY24\,and\,7\%$ in $FY25\,and\,that\,they\,will\,only\,support\,a\,budget$ that includes funding increases for Harc and other nonprofits of this sector.

When did you get involved with Harc?
Will was hired on September 2012

What attracted you to our mission?

He believes that the mission brings the community together. It keeps everyone accounted for and inclusive. Will says, "there is in "us", in the word "inclusive." He is a strong advocate for parents who are raising a child with IDD. It was not in his original career plan to work at Harc. Since he has been employed, "it is not just a job, the mission of Harc became my reason for being employed here, and is now my career", Will explains.

What motivates you throughout the day

Throughout the day, being able to make people happy is very important to him. Will exclaims, "everyone has a right to be happy, if I can contribute to people's happiness, then that's what motivates me."

Of what contribution or achievement are you most proud?

Winning the Corso Award was his biggest achievement he is most proud of. The qualification for winning the award includes someone who goes above and beyond their regular work duties, and who is overall an employee who is a role model for not only the other staff but including the individuals we support.

Do you have an anecdote/story about Harc that really moved you?

"A story that moved me has nothing to do with Harc, but it is a story of Harc's leadership", Will begins to explain. Five to six years ago, a car came down the street and crashed into his house. Causing him and his wife to be displaced from their home until the house's infrastructures were fixed. For two weeks, he was spending \$65 an ight at a hotel that he was finding difficult to afford. So, Will talked to his supervisor, and asked if there was any type of assistance that could help him and his wife during this tough time. The CEO and COO got wind of his situation and put him and his wife in an apartment at Burnwood group home for four months. This amazing opportunity allowed him to get back on his feet, and he found a new appreciation and love for Harc, and was so grateful for the kindness that was shown to him.
