

A Longterm Friendship With Robinson & Cole




Almost 40 years ago, Robinson & Cole started something revolutionary that would change not only the company culture of the law firm, but impact the lives of many. Robinson and Cole started a supported employment program partnership with Harc in 1990. Which gave individuals with intellectual disabilities a chance to work. Robinson and Cole was Harc's first professional job site. The Senior Partner, David Hadden (2009), helped pilot Harc's Supported Employment Program. David has a special place in his heart for Harc, as his children, Jamie and Sam who, had intellectual disabilities. Rhonda Tobin, the firm's Managing Partner explains, "The individuals have been a key part of the firm, partnering with Harc has been a continued great relationship for us."



This summer, Robinson and Cole will be relocating from 280 Trumbull Street in Hartford to a different office building. They are hoping to have construction at the new building wrapped up by June, 2024. An important question came to Rhonda's mind when she heard about the news of moving to a new building. She wanted to confirm that we would continue to have Harc's individualls involved in our work environment. "The answer was an astounding yes! Currently, there is a workspace and office area for the Harc individuals to complete their assignments and work as a group or independently. During the day, some of the work tasks include stocking office supplies, handling the recycling, and assisting with the mail.

Rhonda is happy to say that, "they are very busy and take their job very seriously. Whether they are at the firm with their dedicated Job Coach to help supervise them, or working in their own office area. Having a workspace opportunity for the individuals really makes them a part of our operations. They perform their duties and always have a smile on their faces." For Harc individuals, working at a corporation, like Robinson and Cole, gives them more independence and confidence. Harc is forever grateful for Robinson and Cole. They give the individuals purpose, life skills, and inclusion in today's society in the workforce through the supported employment program.

Camp Bulova and John H. & Ethel G. Noble
Charitable Trust



Harc is honored to receive a grant in support of Camp Bulova from the John H. & Ethel G. Noble Charitable Trust. Camp Bulova is a Saturday respite camp held once a month, during the school year for children and youth ages 3-21 with medically complex needs who reside in the Greater Hartford area. Thanks to their generous support we are now able to offer camp twice a month!

Diversely talented professionals offer sessions that include music therapy, pet therapy, massage therapy, and nursing services. When necessary there is the capacity for a 1:1 staffing ration got each child or youth who needs that level of support. Specially trained staff and a registered nurse are present for each session to address the medical and emotional needs.

This is a chance for our individuals to have fun and thrive in an environment that is capable of supporting their needs.



Camp Bulova provides an avenue for individuals to experience a variety of activities. Our staff create fun themes and an engaging curriculum; which recently included an Easter egg hunt, holiday crafts for St. Patrick's Day and more.

The camp currently costs \$125 per session, and depending on a family's financial circumstance, they may be eligible to receive a discounted rate. The fee is based on a sliding scale where some families will pay the entire \$125, others will get a \$50 discount and some others may pay nothing at all. It is a wonderful program, which many of our individuals look forward to every year, and we are very thankful to the John H. & Ethel G. Noble Charitable Trust for helping make camp bigger and even better.

Thank you to Harc's generous donors who have been leaders in carrying on the vision of our founding families, keeping Harc strong and assuring that our organization continues to be an innovator in its field.
